What is this product?

Type

This is an investment fund established as an Irish Collective Asset-Management Vehicle (ICAV).

Objectives

Investment objective The investment objective of the Sub-Fund is to achieve positive risk adjusted returns.

Investment policies The Sub-Fund will seek to achieve its investment objective by focusing on companies which are, or have the potential to be involved in event driven situations such as mergers and acquisitions arbitrage, large asset disposals, restructuring, special situations and other similar event driven situations events (commonly referred to as "Event Driven Situations").

The Sub-Fund will invest in equities (i.e. shares of companies) equity-related securities (i.e. securities which have the potential to convert into a share of a company) and equity indices (an index measures the price of a basket of securities using a standardized metric and methodology) and bonds (i.e. a debt instrument that represents a loan made by an issuer to a borrower). The Sub-Fund may gain exposure to commodities through exchange traded commodities ("ETCs") or interest rates. The Sub-Fund may also gain exposure to contingent value rights ("CVRs") (i.e. financial instruments such as shares that are issued as part of the consideration paid to the shareholders of companies being acquired in merger and acquisition transactions) and special purpose acquisition companies or "SPACs", which are publicly listed special purpose acquisition companies with the specific purpose of acquiring a private company.

The Sub-Fund's investments will primarily be focussed on companies incorporated in or whose principal economic activity arises in global developed markets. However, the Sub-Fund may also invest in emerging markets.

The Sub-Fund may invest directly or use derivatives, such as options, swaps, credit default swaps, futures, warrants and equity rights, to gain indirect exposure to investments. A derivative is a contract the value of which depends on the change in price of an agreed-upon underlying financial asset, index or security. The Sub-Fund may use indices to gain indirect exposure to equities and any such investment will be made indirectly through index derivatives, such as options, swaps, credit default swaps and futures.

The Sub-Fund can take short positions in any asset class through derivatives, as well as hedging its exposure to an asset class by using derivatives to take an offsetting long or short exposure to the same or another asset class. In broad terms, long positions mean that the Sub-Fund will benefit if prices go up but lose if prices go down. Short positions mean the Sub-Fund will make a profit if the value of the investment goes down, but it will lose money if the value of the investment goes up, unless the loss is capped or offset by another investment. Under normal market conditions, it is expected that the value of the long positions held by the Sub-Fund shall not exceed 200% of the Net Asset Value of the Sub-Fund at any one time and it is expected that at any given time the maximum of the absolute values of

the short positions of the Sub-Fund shall not exceed 150% of the Net Asset Value of the Sub-Fund.

In addition, the Sub-Fund may invest in open-ended exchange traded funds and other open ended collective investment schemes which provide exposures consistent with the above. Investment in open-ended funds will be limited to 10% of the Net Asset Value.

The Sub-Fund may, in certain circumstances, invest up to 100% of its Net Asset Value in cash, cash equivalents, bonds and money market instruments for cash management purposes.

Melqart Asset Management (UK) Limited acts as the sub-investment manager of the Sub-Fund.

Benchmark The Sub-Fund is actively managed, meaning the Investment Manager actively selects and invests the securities in which the Sub-Fund invests with the aim of meeting the investment objective of the Sub-Fund, and is not managed with reference to a benchmark or index.

Redemption and Dealing You may sell your shares in the Sub-Fund any day that banks are open in Dublin, Ireland and London, United Kingdom. You must submit your application to the Sub-Fund's Administrator before 1.00 p.m. three business days before the day on which you want to sell.

Distribution Policy Your shares do not pay income, but instead the Sub-Fund reinvests such income to grow your capital.

Launch date The Sub-Fund came into existence in 2023.

Fund Currency Base currency of the Sub-Fund is EUR.

Conversion of units/shares You may switch your shares to the shares of another Sub-Fund of Tages International Funds ICAV free of charge.

Intended retail investor

This product is intended for investors who plan to stay invested for at least 5 years and are prepared to take on a medium-low level of risk of loss to their original capital in order to get a higher potential return. It is designed to form part of a portfolio of investments.

Term

The Fund is open-ended and has no maturity date. Subject to the liquidation, dissolution and termination rights of the board of the Fund as set forth in the Fund prospectus, the Fund cannot be automatically terminated. The manufacturer, Tages Capital LLP, is not entitled to terminate the product unilaterally.

Depository The Sub-Fund's assets are held with its depository, Northern Trust Fiduciary Services (Ireland) Limited.

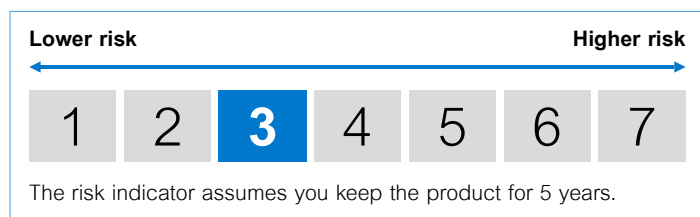

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risks

Performance scenarios

What happens if the Sub-Fund is unable to pay out?

If we are not able to pay you out what we owe you, you are not covered by any national compensation scheme. To protect you, the assets are held with a separate company, a depository. Should we default, the depository would liquidate the investments and distribute the proceeds to the investors. In the worst case, however, you could lose your entire investment.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- in the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario,

- 10,000 EUR is invested.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 5 years

This product is designed for longer term investments; you should be prepared to stay invested for at least 5 years. However, you can redeem your investment without penalty at any time during this period, or hold the investment longer. You may sell your shares in the Sub-Fund on any Wednesday that is a bank business day in Dublin, Ireland and London, England, or if not a bank business day, on the next bank business day. If there are no more bank business days in that calendar month, you may sell your shares on the last bank business day in that month. You must submit your application to the Sub-Fund's Administrator before 1.00 p.m. (Irish time) three business days before the day on which you want to sell.
